

Corn Leaf Tissue Sampling



PRWIN partnered with a Landowner this spring to begin a new project that helps both analyze the amount of nutrients that the corn plants are absorbing and retaining, and the monitoring of nutrient deficiencies. Weekly, we take corn leaf samples and select a leaf below and opposite of a cob. The rain gauge is recorded as well, right before sample collection. This will allow the Landowner to evaluate

> the correlation between rainfall amounts and nutrient loss/ gains. Weekly reports are sent back from the lab to the Land owner, as well as PRWIN. Percentages of nutrients are shown on the reports for the landowner to analyze.


